The Hopedale Presbyterian Church was organized June 10, 1878, by a committee appointed by the Presbytery of Steubenville. Twenty-five members were received into the church at that time.

The new organization worshipped in the Methodist Church until the present building was erected in 1880, by Thomas Baldwin.
