You are invited to join us in celebrating Quilter's Day Out at the Highlands Museum & Discovery Center, 1620 Winchester Avenue, Ashland, KY. Admission is FREE at the museum this **Quilter's Day Out only.**

The theme for this year is **Our Quilt History** with the **1836 Elizabeth Roseberry Mitchell's Graveyard Quilt Top** on display. This piece at the Highlands Museum & Discovery Center and the finished quilt at the Kentucky Historical Society are historical artifacts in women's quilt history and are nationally known to be the only existing graveyard quilt top and quilt of this era. The quilt top and quilt came down through the family to Nina Mitchell Biggs of Greenup County, Kentucky. In 1959 Nina donated the quilt to the Kentucky Historical Society. Nina M. Biggs passed the quilt top to her daughter Rebecca and after Rebecca died it was Elizabeth Roseberry Mitchell's great-great-great granddaughter, Jo Ann Biggs West, who donated the quilt top in the 1980's to the Highlands Museum in Ashland, Kentucky. **This quilt will be on display from March 13 – March 20, 2010.**

**Abraham Lincoln: "The Emancipation and the African-American Experience."** This magnificent quilt exhibit is by curator Dr. Carolyn Mazloomi, a world renowned quilt artist and founder of the Women of Color Quilter's Network. Featured quilt by Carolyn Crump. You don't want to miss this quilt exhibit. **Quilt exhibit, February 5 – March 27, 2010.**

**Highlands Museum will have quilts from their collection display throughout the museum.**

**Sandy Stark will be doing written quilt appraisals;** the cost will be \$30.00. A written appraisal of your quilts is a document you will need for a quilt that is lost, stolen or destroyed, for the purpose of insurance.
